Festive Apple Cranberry Salad From Kraft Food and Family

- 1/2 c. mayonnaise1/2 c. balsamic vinaigrette dressing1 green and 1 red apple, coarsely chopped
- 8 c. chopped romaine

1/2 c. dried cranberries

- 1-4oz. package crumbled feta cheese
- 1 c. chopped pecans, toasted

Mix mayo and dressing until blended; toss with apples. Spoon into large bowl and top with layers of all remaining ingredients except nuts. Toss gently before serving; top with nuts. Or refrigerate until ready to serve, then toss and top with nuts.

Coconut-Pumpkin Pudding Pie From Kraft Food and Family

1 1/4 c. graham cracker crumbs
 1/4 c. butter, melted
 3/4 c. flaked coconut, divided
 1-3.4oz. package vanilla instant pudding

1/2 c. cold milk1-15oz. can pumpkin1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice2 c. thawed whipped topping, divided

Heat oven to 350°. Mix graham cracker crumbs, butter and 1/2 c. coconut; press into bottom and up sides of a 9-inch pie plate. Bake 8-10 mins. Or until lightly browned; cool completely.

Beat pudding mix, milk, pumpkin, and spice with a whisk for 2 mins. Stir in 1 c. whipped topping. Pour into crust; top with remaining whipped topping. Refrigerate 3 hours or until firm. Meanwhile, toast remaining coconut; cool. Sprinkle toasted coconut over pie just before serving. To toast coconut: Spread coconut in shallow pan. Bake in 350° oven 5-7 mins or until lightly browned, stirring occasionally. Or, spread onto bottom of microwaveable pie plate. Microwave on HIGH 4 mins. or until lightly browned, stirring every 2 mins.
