

BCSSI 2020 Annual Celebration Charting Our Course



BCSSI hosted its 2020 Annual Celebration on February 19th. Community members, board members and staff celebrated the agency's 2019 accomplishments.

Attendees enjoyed a delicious breakfast prepared by Shoup's Country Foods. Anita Bowen, Executive Director, gave her annual update....below is a summary of her remarks.

"Have you ever experienced a "let down" after a major event or celebration in your life? All of the activity and frenzy leading up to it and then... it's over and you're not sure what to do with yourself. You all may remember that 2018 was a BIG, BIG year for BCSSI as we celebrated our 40th anniversary...all year long. So, when we entered 2019, would our emotions be down? Would we not know how to handle that 41st year? Oh no, we entered the year robustly armed with a brand new 5vear Strategic Plan that would "Chart Our Course" for 2019 and beyond. At BCSSI, all of you, including our team of 38 dedicated staff members help us celebrate every year, and guite honestly every DAY because we are privileged to be making such a positive impact in the quality of life throughout Boone County. You are what makes this ship sail. Thank you.

The first year of our Strategic Plan gave us reason to pause as we looked ahead to four exciting goal areas including:

- 1. Expanding our services and attracting diverse ages
- 2. Broadening our physical reach
- 3. Increasing our organizational capacity
- 4. Developing new revenue sources through a comprehensive development program

(Several successes from the Strategic Plan were shared with attendees.)

BCSSI and the Boone County Senior Services Foundation (BCSSF) have recently implemented a Planned Giving program. The goal of the Planned Giving program is to give donors the power to leave a legacy gift that will make an impact on Boone County's growing senior population and make certain BCSSI can continue to offer its valuable services well into the future.

In 2020, the BCSSF has a goal to locate 20 individuals or families that will serve as the founding members of our Legacy Program. By making their intent known, their name will be placed on a beautiful, hand-crafted Legacy Tree that has recently been installed in our Lebanon office lobby.

The Legacy tree was designed and created by metal artist Craig Voight of Craig Voight Concepts. Craig is from Mooresville and is a Battalion Chief with the Pike Township Fire Department. He has been a Firefighter for more than 28 years and served with BCSSF board member and retired fireman Paul Mohler for many of those years. Paul is who connected the BCSSF to Craig and his talented work.

Craig has worked with metal for fifteen years but has become more involved in the last five years. He first became interested in metal design



due to his love of motorcycle building as well as encouragement from his fellow fireman. For our Legacy tree, Craig used three, 4 feet by 8 feet sheets of hot rolled steel and for the patina he used a blackmill scale, along with a copper sulfate mixture applied to the surface. He then used his artistic design to scuff the surface

to bring more character and texture to the leaves. It took Craig about twenty hours to create the Legacy tree.



Craig is married and has two daughters and one step-daughter. He is also a new grandfather. **BCSSI would like to thank Craig for this time and talent for this very special project!**

Holy Cow Cake Recipe Submitted By: Sharon Walker

1-18 oz. Devil's Food cake mix* 1 1/3 c. water 1/2 c. vegetable oil 3 eggs 8 oz. caramel topping

14 oz. can sweetened condensed milk 1 c. butterfinger candy bar, crushed 12 oz. frozen whipped topping, thawed 8 oz. cream cheese, softened

Preheat oven to 350. Lightly spray a 13x9 pan with cooking spray. Mix cake mix, water, oil, and eggs with an electric mixer on low speed for 1 min., scrape sides and mix at medium for 2 more mins. The batter should be thick and well blended. Pour into prepared pan. Bake until the cake springs back when lightly pressed with your finger and just starts to pull away from the sides of the pan, 35-38 mins. While cake is baking, prepare the topping. Place caramel topping and condensed milk



in a bowl and stir to combine. Place baked cake on a wire cooling rack. Immediately poke holes in the top of the cake with a straw or chopstick. Spoon topping over the warm cake. Sprinkle half of the crushed candy bar over the cake. Place whipped topping and cream cheese in a large bowl and blend with an electric mixer until smooth and combined. Spread over cake. Sprinkle with remaining candy pieces. Place cake, uncovered, in refrigerator to chill for at least 20 minutes before serving. Store cake, covered in the refrigerator for up to 1 week.

> Tomato Basil Salmon **Recipe From Allrecipes.com**

2– 6oz Salmon filets

- 1 Tbs. dried basil
- 1 tomato, thinly sliced

- 1 Tbs. olive oil
- 2 Tbs. grated Parmesan cheese

Heat oven to 375. Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil and spray with cooking spray. Place salmon of foil and sprinkle with basil. Top with tomato slices, drizzle with olive oil, and sprinkle with Parmesan. Bake until opaque in the center, about 20 minutes.
