

Charitable Giving with Assets


Let's face it. We have more stuff than we need, than our kids want, than we know what to do with. Giving personal property can be

a great way to satisfy your charitable intentions without having to use cash. Here are a few things that might be donated now, or through your will, that can help BCSSI in its mission of service:

Farm land, a rental home, or that lot on the lake you never got around to putting a cottage on, can be gifted now, or at your passing. Such a gift generally qualifies for a tax deduction equal to its appraised fair market value. If you worry what to do with your home, there are ways to gift your home, farm or second home now, continue to use and enjoy it for your lifetime, receive an immediate tax benefit, and have BCSSI utilize the proceeds when you are gone. It is called a "retained life estate," and can be a powerful way to give.

You can also gift personal items such as jewelry, vehicles and artwork if they have significant value and you no longer need them. There are minimum values and often appraisals involved, but we can talk through the options with you. Bank accounts can be gifted through a pay-on-death designation (ask your banker) and brokerage and retirement accounts can be gifted in whole or in part through a beneficiary designation. These assets then are not part of your taxable estate, and the amount transferred to BCSSI is the balance at your death.

Just remember in considering gifting assets to take care of yourself and your needs and consider how you wish to be remembered through your ultimate gift. The Boone County Senior Services Foundation can help. Just reach out when the time is right for you.

Important Prescription and Over-the-Counter (OTC) DRUG REMINDERS:

- Be aware that some of your medicines won't mix well with other medications, including OTC drugs, herbal remedies and alcohol.
- Read all labels carefully and follow the directions exactly.
- Look for pictures or statements on your pill bottles that tell you if you need to take the medicine with food; shouldn't drink alcohol; or gives other important instructions.
- Remind your doctor and pharmacist about any previous conditions that might affect your ability to take a certain medicine.
- Don't be afraid to ask questions if you do not understand something about your prescription or want more information.
- Dispose of all medications properly.

Cheesecake Stuffed Apples Recipe Submitted By: Michelle Katsaros, Asst. Director of Transportation

2 – 8 oz. packages cream cheese, at room temp.	1/2 c. crushed graham crackers, about 5 whole crackers
2/3 c. + 2 Tbsp. sugar	1/8 tsp. ground cinnamon
1 tsp. vanilla	2 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
2 large eggs, at room temp., beaten	Prepared caramel sauce, for serving
8 medium baking apples	1/2 c. toasted walnuts, roughly chopped

Mix together cream cheese, 2/3 c. sugar and vanilla with a rubber spatula in a medium bowl until completely smooth. Add eggs and stir until completely combined. Arrange a rack in the center of the oven and preheat to 300 degrees. Cut a 1/4 inch off the top of each apple and use a melon baller or teaspoon to remove the stem and core and to hollow out about 2/3 of the apple leaving 1/2 inch of flesh around the edge. Fill each apple with cheesecake batter to just below the rim. Wipe away any drips or spills from the outside and top of apples before baking. Arrange apples in a 9x13 baking pan and bake until the apples are soft but still hold their shape and have not split, 45-50 mins. Let cool completely before serving. Meanwhile pulse together the graham crackers, cinnamon and remaining 2 Tbsp. of sugar in a food processor until fine crumbs. Add butter and process until combined. Divide apples among small serving plates and top each with a generous drizzle of caramel and sprinkles of chopped walnuts and graham cracker mixture.

Cheesy Beef Quesadillas **Recipe From: delish**

In a large skillet over medium-high heat, brown beef. Season with salt and pepper. Add garlic, onion, and black beans and cook on medium-low for 5 mins. Turn off heat and mix in avocado and cilantro. Warm a large non-stick pan over medium. heat with 1 tsp. oil. Place tortilla in pan and sprinkle one half with cheese and beef mixture. Fold over and fry lightly on both sides until cheese is melted. Repeat with remaining tortillas. Cut into wedges and serve with lime and sour cream.
