Planning: Think about what you will need and want in the future, from home and community-based services to community activities that interest you.


Engagement: Remain involved and contribute to your community through work, volunteer, and/or civic participation opportunities.

BCSSI Spotlight Mary Grabianowski BCSSI Volunteer & Board Member

I like helping with the Health Expo and the Senior Olympics. Both of these activities offer wellness opportunities as well as being lots of fun.

How many years have you lived in Boone County and what makes Boone County special?

I have lived in Boone County all my life – born at Witham Hospital in 1950. It is special to me because I am so rooted here and I have so many wonderful memories and friends.

Profession or former profession if retired:

I retired from teaching Social Studies at Zionsville Community High School in 2016. I loved teaching, but am so glad I retired before the pandemic!

I enjoy reading, gardening and cooking. I mostly enjoy being active in the community and trying to make a difference. In addition to being on the Board for BCSSI, I am also on the Board for Shalom and love serving meals, delivering meals and working with the Kids Sack Lunch Program. I am on the Zionsville Plan Commission and find it very interesting to help oversee the growth and development of our community. I am active in my church and feel that spiritual development is a key to our growth as individuals.

What do you want others to know about BCSSI or why should they get involved?

I encourage everyone to participate in the programs that BCSSI offers. If someone is able to help with those programs, has a talent to share, or wants to get a job as a bus driver – we can use your vision and energy.

Dealing with Inflation: Know your numbers

All of us oldsters have been taken aback by the inflation numbers reported recently. Yes, many things cost more at the checkout than a year ago, but how does it affect you, specifically?

What you see on the media is the CPI-U, the Consumer Price Index for a market basket of usual and normal expenditure categories of Urban dwellers. So the 12-month increase (I am using November 2021 numbers from AARP) was 6.8%. But, did you know there is also a CPI-E market basket for seniors aged 62 and above, based on their spending habits? The five big areas of increased consumption on the CPI-E for seniors included gas and energy, vehicle purchases, medical care, drugs, and food.

So how do seniors cope? Plan your driving trips to maximize efficiency. No burnouts or fast braking (uses up more gas). Stay healthy. Buy in bulk if possible. Compare prices. Steaks went up about 10.7% last year, while hamburger held even. Get control of your investments with a trusted advisor. Interestingly, health care and drugs were not at the top of the percentage of increase in cost, the frequency of visits made the difference for the index.

Remember, you can still afford to be a donor! Every tax filer is able to deduct up to \$500 in charitable donations, even if they do not itemize their taxes. Be sure to take advantage of this leverage to remember others who are less fortunate.


