

BCSSI is a community-based organization dedicated to improving the lives of the 60+ population in our region. Our conduct policy is designed to allow all BCSSI participants to feel at ease, to create an enjoyable atmosphere for all, and to protect the facilities that we all enjoy using. Participation in the organization's programs is subject to the observance of the Center's rules and procedures. Any participant or



staff member who violates this Code is subject to removal from the program and could be banned from the Center. This code of conduct applies to all BCSSI sponsored events. Simply stated, it is our policy that all participants, staff, and volunteers will treat others respectfully and courteously. Please treat others in the same manner that you would like to be treated.

The activities outlined below are strictly prohibited:

- Loud, disruptive, obscene, or abusive language
- Entering the Center and/or attending a program while intoxicated
- Bringing onto BCSSI'S property dangerous or unauthorized materials such as explosives, firearms, weapons, or other similar items
- Discourtesy or rudeness
- Actual or threatened violence toward any individual or group, or conduct that could potentially endanger the life, safety, health, or well-being of others
- Lack of personal cleanliness and proper hygiene
- Harassment of participants or staff, based on Federal, State, and local civil or human rights and statutes
- Ostracizing or taking unfair advantage of any participant
- Abuse of the Center or its contents, including misuse, theft, or abuse of the building, furnishings, equipment, or supplies, and/or abuse or theft of another person's property

2 pkg. vanilla instant pudding

3 c. cold milk

1-4oz pkg. white chocolate, melted

1-8oz. tub Cool Whip

13. Toy for a windy day.

14. Mildly hot.

1 pkg. thin lemon cookies

1 lb. fresh strawberries, sliced

2 tsp. lemon zest

Whisk pudding mixes and milk in a medium bowl for 2 min. Stir in chocolate and half of the Cool Whip. Crumble 3 cookies and reserve for garnish along with 1/4c. of strawberries. Place 6 of remaining cookies in single layer on the bottom of a trifle dish; top with 1/3 of the pudding mix and 1/3 of the strawberries. Cover with 1/2 of the remaining cookies, pudding and strawberries; repeat layers. Top with remaining cool whip. Refrigerate at least 1 hour.
