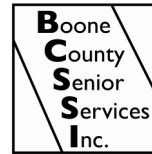

Yes, we are designated as the county's senior service organization for adults over age 60 and the public transit agency for people of all ages. But do you know what that really means? We encourage you to come visit at our location in Lebanon and/or Zionsville... or to at least give us a call. You might be surprised to find that we, too, are having a *wander-ful time in all seasons*. 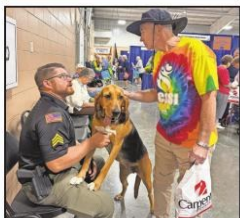

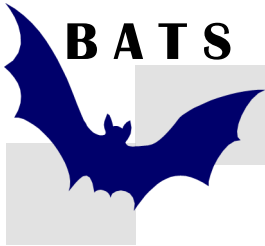

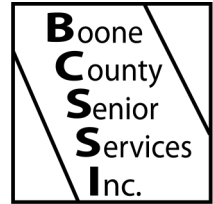

Pumpkin Bars

From: SallysBakingAddiction.com

For the Bars:

2 c. flour
1 1/2 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt
1 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon
2 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
1 c. vegetable oil
3 large eggs
1 c. packed brown sugar
1/3 c. granulated sugar

2 Tbsp. maple syrup
1-15oz. can pumpkin puree
1 1/2 tsp. vanilla

Cream Cheese Frosting:

8 oz. cream cheese-room temp
1/4 c. unsalted butter-room temp
3 c. confectioner's sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
1/4 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
1/8 tsp. salt



Heat oven to 350 and grease a 10x15 pan. Whisk together dry ingredients in a large bowl. Whisk wet ingredients, including the sugars, in a separate bowl. Pour wet ingredients into dry ingredients and whisk or use a mixer to combine. Mixture will be thick. Spread batter into prepared pan and bake for 28-35 minutes, until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool bars completely. Make the frosting: Beat butter and cream cheese with a mixer until smooth and creamy. Add remaining ingredients, beat on low speed for 30 seconds and then high speed for 2 minutes. If you would like the frosting to be thicker, add 1/4 c. of confectioner's sugar. Spread on cooled bars. Refrigerate for 30 minutes before serving. Cover leftover bars tightly and refrigerate.
